Farmer Time is accessed through FaceTime, Skype or any social media video app that you have agreed with your matched farmer/teacher.

With FREE access to a wide variety of live interactive broadcasts and video on demand with live chat support, you can educate your class on careers and health education.

The Learn Live technology is free to schools and colleges and doesn't require any additional equipment to be purchased or procured to interact with the live broadcasts. All broadcasts can be viewed via interactive whiteboards or projectors using IE or Google Chrome browsers on existing laptops, PCs or via an app on tablet devices.

## Online / Remote Learning

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### [YES Services, East Sussex](#)

**YES will be offering an online video-linked support until further notice.** Young people can still access the same face to face level of guidance and support from DBS checked specialist advisers, but through a secure video link rather than in person.

All appointments in schools, colleges, our offices and the community have now been postponed or rearranged through this alternative process.

The experienced and friendly team can provide information and advice to learners around transition from Years 11, 12 and 13, and support and guidance to young people aged 16-18 who are not in education, employment or training. They can support young people up to the age of 25 if they have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP) or are a looked after child.

In addition to the usual contact with young people by phone, email, text, WhatsApp and Facebook, video-linked appointments via online platforms such as Skype and 'GoTo Meeting' are utilised to best support young people throughout the county.

## **Multi Open Online Courses**

MOOCs are free online courses written by the world's universities. They can take a variety of forms, but students will probably find it easiest to find a self-paced MOOC, so that you are not giving yourself extra deadlines. MOOCs are fantastic for learning more about a curriculum topic, going deeper into a topic than is covered on the curriculum, and testing whether you are actually interested in a subject that you are considering at University, if you have not studied it before (e.g., anthropology, astronomy etc.).
